

CONTINUING EDUCATION UNITS (CEUs)



CEUs are education modules that have been reviewed and approved by a continuing education organization. CEUs support the professional development of learners who are enhancing their knowledge, skills, and abilities in the advancement of the interior design profession. Upon successful completion of a CEU, learners earn credit to meet professional development requirements needed to maintain ASID practitioner membership, state licensure, and/or other credentials.

REQUIREMENTS:

At a minimum, CEUs must be approved by the [International Design Continuing Education Council \(IDCEC\)](#) to be offered through ASID. CEUs approved by IDCEC must be at least 30 minutes in length. CEUs cannot include references to brands or products.

CEUs may also be approved by other third-party accrediting bodies, including the American Institute of Architects (AIA), Green Business Certification Inc. (GBCI), and/or others as applicable.

EXAMPLES OF EDUCATIONAL DELIVERY METHODS

Live, in-person seminars, panel discussions, and workshops

Synchronous distance learning through live, online webinars and virtual meetings

Asynchronous distance learning on-demand via podcast, online discussion forums, and pre-recorded video that can be accessed on-demand or within a specified time frame

LEARNER ATTENDANCE AND REPORTING

Refer to the CEU approval organization for specific requirements and reporting details. In general, the content provider is responsible for reporting learner credits. The following are guideline for tracking attendance:

For Live, In-Person, Webinar, or Virtual Meeting - Learner attendance must be tracked.

For Asynchronous Distance Learning On-Demand through the ASID Academy - CEU can only be awarded if some form of learner assessment is included (e.g., knowledge quiz, project evaluation tool) in order for credit to be earned.
