ASID Student Chapter Annual Goals:

- 1 View ASID Leadership Training Program Modules online at the beginning of each semester -- www.asid.org/chapter/studentresources
- 2 Ensure all student chapter members are active ASID student members. Cross-check with a roster from ASID Headquarters and/or ask student chapter members for ASID ID number at meeting check-ins
- 3 Survey student chapter members -- [Refer to Student Chapter Survey Template](#)
- 4 Hold a recruitment event each semester -- [Refer to Student Recruitment Cheat Sheet](#)
- 5 Develop a “Senior/Freshman Buddy System”
- 6 Host a student chapter kickoff mixer event and invite other design-related campus organizations such as IIDA, AIA or USGBC.
- 7 Interact with ASID professional chapter members
 - Invite members to campus as resume/portfolio reviewers or guest speakers
 - Attend a professional chapter event or meeting
 - Invite your regional Student Rep to the Board (SRB) to a student chapter meeting. Discuss information for the SRB to bring back to professional chapter board.
 - Ask local ASID Industry Partners for tours of showrooms or product demos
- 8 Host one fundraiser event per semester -- [Refer to Student Chapter Fundraiser Toolkit](#)
- 9 Hold student chapter elections by March -- [Refer to Student Chapter Election Guide](#)
- 10 Develop student chapter strategic plan in the spring prior to or the start of Fall semester -- [Refer to Student Chapter Strategic Planning Guide](#)

Additional Suggestions:

- Open communication with SRB, Student Advisory Council (SAC), Student and Emerging Professional Programs Team at ASID Headquarters , etc. Make it a goal to communicate with the RIGHT people to help your student chapter.
- Honor Graduate Tips: Twice a year in December and May - **Recruiting and Retaining Emerging Professionals: A Chapter Model**
- Host a student chapter event that puts interior design skills to practice
 - a. Community Service Projects (ex: redesign the living area of a domestic abuse shelter)
 - b. Research pre-existing opportunities (ex: redesign a fraternity or sorority house)
 - c. Find a problem with campus to improve and create a proposal (If passed, fundraisers can be tied to this event)
- Weekly meet-up spots – suggest certain times to just meet up and eat lunch, do work, etc.
